Asterby and Goulceby Parish Council

The last meeting of the Parish Council took place on 12th March 2025. As well as the three Parish Councillors being in attendance there were two members of the public along with both the representative County Councillor and District Councillor.

The agenda was relatively short and consideration was given to just one planning matter. A review of current banking arrangements was discussed and a decision was made to remain with the current bank Lloyds, and to move over to on-line banking. The auditor for the 24/25 financial year was appointed at a reduced cost when compared to the previous year. Consideration was given to the purchase of VE day markers to affix to road sign posts in the two villages. Given that they would simply be disposed of following the day it was decided not to incur this cost.

Both the District and County Councillors brought the Council up to date with all the relevant major developments at both local and county level.

Grant funding

In its budget for the 25/26 year the Parish Council has a very small budget to allow for some grant funding. The eligibility for grant funding is as follows:

To qualify for a grant, the applicant must be able to demonstrate that any funding provided by the Parish Council will be of benefit to the Parish of Asterby and Goulceby, or its residents.

The Parish Council will not normally make grants to organisations outside of the parish unless it can be demonstrated that there are direct benefits to the Parish.

Grants will not be awarded towards day to day running costs, and the project must be sustainable without continuous funding from the Parish Council. The application should provide clear details of what the proposed funding will be used for itemising, where applicable, services to be provided or equipment to be purchased along with costs such that the Council can determine the exact proposed use of the applied for funds.

Other factors that the Parish Council will take into account when considering a grant application include;

- Whether the Parish Council has the power to make this grant.

- Whether the grant being requested is proportionate to the benefit.

- Whether the applicant has demonstrated some degree of fundraising on a "self-help" basis.

- Whether the applicant has applied to other bodies for funding for the same project.

Grants can only be awarded by resolution of the Full Council and are dependent on the availability of funds and the suitability of the application.

The next meeting of the Parish Council is on Wednesday 7th May at the Three Horseshoes, Goulceby. At 6.30pm there is the Annual Parish Meeting followed at 7.00pm by the Annual Parish Council Meeting. All are welcome to both meetings.

VE Day 8th May 2025

As a tribute to remember those lost in our area during WWII, the following letter was obtained from the book 'Letters to Loved Ones' written by Rose Rouse.

Twenty-one-year-old Eric Rawlings was the wireless operator and air gunner on Wellington R1463 based at Snaith in Yorkshire. Returning from a raid on the night of 21st February 1942, the aircraft flew into a hill in Asterby, Lincolnshire in the early hours of 22nd February. Eric and three others were killed that night. The following letter was written by Eric, given to his brother Norman for safekeeping and passed to his parents upon his death.

"Dearest Folks, Now that I'm on operational work and admitting that the risk is fairly considerable, I thought I would just put a few words on paper which you could keep as a remembrance in case anything should happen to me.

In the revoltingly chaotic world today where everyone is fighting and killing everyone else, it has always been wonderful just to take my thoughts from worldly beastliness and to think of the things which I revere and esteem most in the world – my family and my home.

Love is such a very difficult thing to express here and now on paper, but I only hope that I've made you all understand and realise the depth of my love and the gratitude for everything which you have done for me. Whenever there's fighting going on anywhere, you can always hear the words from people not involved – 'Half of them don't know what they're fighting about anyway.' Which is usually true. Well, I know what I'm fighting for. I'm fighting so that in the future people will have the chance to live as happily as we all did together before the War without interference. Where young un's like myself could make the most of the marvellous opportunities which you gave me for 20 years and for which I know you made many sacrifices. God bless you all, and may everything turn out right in the end.


