

Co-option of new councillors

The Parish Council is pleased to announce that two new councillors have been co-opted, Jake Taylor and Frances Headley and we look forward to working with them. We had six applicants for two positions. All of the applicants would have been an asset to the Parish Council and we were extremely grateful to all who expressed an interest.

Annual meeting of the parish council with parishioners

The Annual meeting with Parishioners took place on Monday 22 May at 7pm at Donington on Bain Village Hall and was well attended with 9 residents in attendance and the newly elected ELDC Cllr Daniel Simpson.

Speeding in the village was a focus of the meeting.

The Parish Council has been looking at ways to address speeding in the village. It is proposed to purchase a speed detector qun. A number of residents have already volunteered to join a team of volunteers to organise and run the project. Further volunteers are requested. If you are willing to volunteer to assist the speed gun team, please contact the clerk at dongingtononbainpc@gmail.com or Cllr Richard Wright. The Parish Council is looking at borrowing a speed detection gun initially to assess the extent of the speeding issue. If speeding is found to be an issue the parish council will consider options to address speeding, including purchase of a speed detector gun.

Proposals to erect new village signs

We are proposing to erect two new village signs. These will be silhouette style in powdered steel. We are currently running a competition at Donington on Bain Primary School to design the concept of the sign.

Refurbishment of the MUGA

The Parish Council would like to thank those who responded to the MUGA questionnaire. We had 44 responses supporting the council's proposals to refurbish the MUGA area using parish council reserves. We are still pursuing grant funding for part of the project. The first stage will be completed shortly, clearing of moss and cleaning of the surface.

Coronation mugs were presented to the children at Donington on Bain primary school and pre school. All of the children in Donington on Bain Primary School and Pre School had been presented with a coronation mug. Additional coronation mugs had been ordered and would be distributed by a volunteer parishioner to the younger children in the village.





The Horncastle Road remains closed due to the unsafe condition of one section due to damage caused by badgers. The Parish Council has been advised that the badgers need to be removed during a certain period, after which the road damage will be addressed.

There have been a number of fly tips on the Horncastle Road recently and to date those responsible have not been formally identified. The Parish Council has offered ELDC any assistance it can in terms of monitoring fly tipping activity. We are grateful to ELDC who have responded very quickly following this criminal activity taking place.

The newly installed planters on the bridge on Watery Lane in Goulceby are now fully planted and will be maintained over the summer months. The mindless vandalism of the Asterby notice board was noted in the last newsletter. The cost of a replacement door proved far too expensive to justify so we are looking at alternative ways as to how we might remedy the damage.

Moving on - A short history of time spent at 'Thorngate'

Paddy and I arrived at 'Thorngate' in March 1998.

We had spent some time looking for a property with land within the Wolds and then knew we had found the perfect place.

As Paddy was still working in Saudi Arabia his time here was limited. Getting the animals safe and secure in the field was a priority. We had pigmy goats, geese, ducks, chickens and 2 dogs and a cat. The 2 goldfish were trouble free. The alpacas came later on. I kept a detailed diary of my days here with the many dramas of keeping the animals and the lovely walks which I enjoyed with the dogs.

The first building work was to make the drive, our neighbours thought we were building a swimming pool! Work was also going on in the bungalow, our bedroom and then another one. This was used for B&B guests and later on for children from social services who stayed here for respite care.

When Paddy left Saudi Arabia, he worked at B&Q at Lincoln and then in a residential home for students with special needs.

We loved our holidays in the caravan and longer ones travelling to Canada and America crossing the Atlantic on Queen Mary 2.

Paddy was always busy outside in the garden and I see the results of his work every time I go outside.

Then the unthinkable happened and Paddy was diagnosed with cancer. Despite treatment, he died within a year.

'Thorngate' holds many happy memories and parties indoors and outside as well. I shall miss the community around me and especially all my church friends who have supported me in different ways. So now I have decided to have a new adventure. The bungalow is too big and so is the garden and I shall move to a smaller property in Woodhall Spa.
